If you haven't

This is another shorty folks. The summer's a busy time. I'll just leave you with a fly pattern and say so long, til next month so I can get this to the presses and in the mail.

CREAM CAHILL

This pattern worked extremely well on the Current River several weeks ago.

Here's the recipe:

Hook Size:

10 -16, Mustad 94840

Wing: Very pale cream mallard flank feather. Body: White, or pale cream polypropylene.

Hackle: Two, white or cream dry fly hackles,

sized to hook.

Tail:

Tan, or ginger hackle fibres

Here's the pattern:

TIE-IN LIGHT COLORED MALLARD FLANK WINGS. WINDS SHOULD BE APPROX. AS LONG AS THE SHANK OF THE HOOK, TIE-IN WITH FIGURE EIGHT TO SPLIT WINGS.

IMPORTANT : TIE-IN WING AT 1/3 POINT" ON HOOK. TO FAR FORWARD AND PLY FLOAT ON 'MS

2. TIE-IN TWO HACKLE FIBRES BEHIND WING.

DUB TAPERED BODY UP TO WINGS AND HACKLE FIBRES.

DUB BODY TIGHTLY AND USE JUST ENOUGH DUBBING TO COUBLE THREAD.

3. WIND THREAD TO REAK OF HOOK AND TIE-IN TAIL HALRIE FIRRES.

- MAKE ONE WRAP UNDER TAIL TO HOLD MORE SECURELY IN PLACE,

4. WIND EACH HACKLE

APPROX. TWO WRAPS EACH BEHIND AND

SEPARATELY. IN FRONT OF THE WING,
