#### FLY TYING

### Obscure Catskill Flies, Installment #3: the Delaware Adams

Continuing with my series on obscure Catskill flies, this month's installment is on a relatively recent dry fly pattern by Walt Dette, the Delaware Adams.

The original Adams, developed by Leonard Halladay of Mayfield, Michigan, about 1922, is probably the most widely used trout fly in North America. It and the Light Cahill have been the #1 and #2 sellers in the commercial market for the last twenty years or more. Like most flies of widespread popularity, the Adams is successful because it resembles a variety of natural flies. Not only is it a passable imitation of many grayish mayflies, but its grizzly/brown hackle and grizzly hackle tip wings create a mottled, broken-up light pattern that simulates a fluttering gray caddis. The Delaware Adams is a Catskill modification of the original pattern. With its palmered grizzly body hackle, the Delaware Adams floats better than the original Adams and goes a step farther in imitating a fluttering caddis. The olive-green body is a common color for adult caddis.

Hook: standard length dry fly

Tying silk: olive

Tail: grizzly hackle fibers

Wings: grizzly hackle tips, upright divided

Body: olive-green dubbing with a grizzly hackle

palmered down the body

Hackle: brown and grizzly mixed

First tie in the tail, then move forward to set the wings in standard dry fly style. Remember not to set the wings too far forward; Catskill flies should have the head set back a little from the hook eye. Next, move back to the tail and attach the body hackle tip first. This hackle should be about one size smaller than the collar hackle. I also prefer to attach a length of very fine (38 gauge) dark wire to counter-wrap over the body hackle for durability (as an alternative, the hackle can be counter-wrapped with the tying silk). Dub the body, wind the body hackle and counter-wrap, then attach and wind the collar hackles, intermixing the brown abd grizzly. Whip finish.


The only published description and photo of this fly that I know of is in Eric Leiser's The Book of Fly Patterns. Although Eric knows the Dette's well and describes the fly as having black tying silk and an olive floss body, the Dette-tied fly in my collection is as described above, with olive tying silk and a rather bright olive-green dubbed body. Take your pick and
