life in general.


#### TRUITE AU BLEU

This recipe comes from the late James Beard and is a great way to prepare trout streamside. The trout must be alive. Slit and gut them just before you plunge them into the broth.

Prepare the broth of 3 parts water to one part vinegar. Add 6 peppercorns, a bay leaf, and a pinch of salt to each quart of liquid. Plunge in the trout and poach them just long enough to cook through - about 4 minutes for the average fish.

Serve them hot with melted butter and boiled potatoes, or chill them and serve with cold mayonnaise.

The vinegar in the water turns the skin of the trout a vivid, metallic blue; hence the name *truite au bleu*.
