Bethel Trout: To Be or Not To Be?

In early September the board was notified that the City of Columbia will no longer provide funding to support the winter trout fishing program at Bethel Park. Without funding from the City or another source, the stocking of trout in Bethel Park will end. Not only will some enjoyable trout fishing disappear, our kids fishing day will be impacted.

The Missouri Department of Conservation works with municipalities around our state to provide Winter Trout Fishing programs. A municipality wishing to participate must meet several qualifications. One of those is the ability to provide some financial assistance. This only seems appropriate as it will be local residents that benefit the most from the program. The financial assistance required of the City of Columbia was \$2500.

While this program does not directly support cold water conservation, it provides a tremendous opportunity each fall to get children hooked on trout fishing. It is our youth that will ensure that our conservation efforts today continue in the future. Therefore, the board feels that the program is of tremendous value.

Ideally the board would like to find private financing to cover the cost of the program. This could come in the form of local/individual support, or perhaps a corporate sponsor. The time frame to accomplish such financing is short, but with effort may be done.

The board has heard from several individuals who have indicated they are willing to personally contribute as much as \$100 each, in support of the program. Only 25 such volunteers and the program will continue. Another source of funding would be for our Chapter to fund all or part of the \$2500 for this year's stocking. The board feels that such a large expenditure, almost half our operating budget, must be brought to a vote for our members. This vote only applies for the 2008 stocking. The board asks that you make your opinion heard by answering the following question(s.)
