### FISHING UPDATE BENNETT SPRINGS STATE PARK

MAJOR HATCHES WHICH WERE NOTICED THROUGHOUT THE DAY INCLUDED: (5-23-86)

CADDIS FLIES: LIGHT BROWN CADDIS WITH YELLOW BODIES. SIZES 16-18. TRY ELK HAIR CADDIS WITH OR WITHOUT HACKLE. FISH SEEMED TO FEED SELECTIVELY ON THE ADULTS- POSSIBLY FEEDING ON THE "EASIER" EMERGING PUPAE.

MAY FLIES: SULFERS - SIZES 16-18. NOT AS ABUNDANT AS THE CADDIS, BUT SUPER PREY AS THE ADULT.

MIDGES: ASSORTED - SIZES 22-26. DUNS, OLIVES AND GRIZZELIES

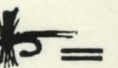

AUGUST 12<sup>TH</sup> - BOARD OF DIRECTOR'S MEETING.

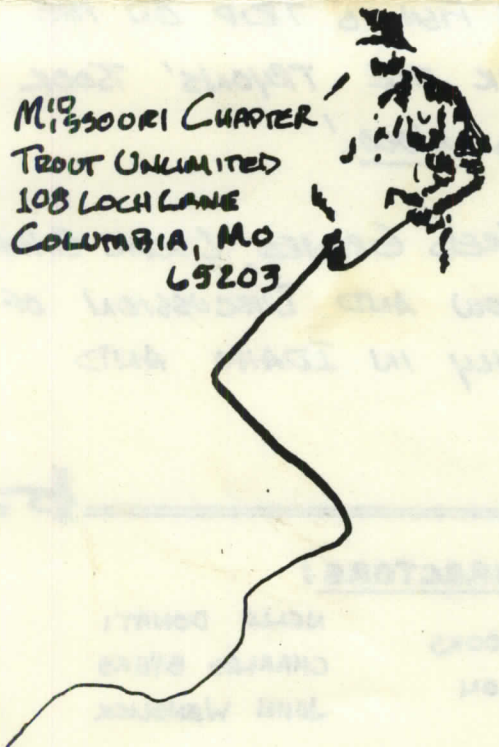

(FROM THE STATE COUNCIL MEETING)

- OZARK COUNCIL, OF WHICH THE MID-MISSOURI CHAPTER IS A PART OF, INCLUDES THE FOLLOWING AREAS: EASTERN 1/2 OF KANSAS, ALL OF IOWA, ALL OF MISSOURI AND THE NORTHEASTERN 1/4 OF ARIZONA. WE ARE ATTEMPTING TO ABSORB SOUTHERN ILLINOIS.
- THE MID-MISSOURI CHAPTER IS ALLOTTED TWO VOTES, CURRENTLY. ONE FOR THE PRESIDENT, AND ONE FOR EACH SIGNIFICANT FRACTION OF FIFTY MEMBERS.
- SILTATION MONITORING IS CURRENTLY BEING DONE AT LAKE TANNEY COMO.
- OUR CONSERVATION PROJECT FOR THE NEXT YEAR IS TREE PLANTING ALONG THE SPRING CREEK - SOUTHWEST OF ROLLA, OFF HIGHWAY J, NEAR FORT LEONARD WOOD AND THE BIG PINEY. PRESENTLY, SUN FILTRATION TO THE STREAM IS CAUSING RISING WATER TEMPERATURES AND SUBSEQUENT FISH KILLS. IT IS HOPED THAT SHADING OF FAST GROWING SYCAMORES, COTONWOODS AND MAPLES WILL LOWER WATER TEMPERATURES AND LESSEN THE FISH KILLS. TREES WILL BE PROVIDED BY THE MISSOURI CONSERVATION DEPARTMENT. THE PROJECT IS COORDINATED BY CHUCK AND SHARON TRYON.
