Once again this year we sponsored scholarships for women to attend a Casting for Recovery Retreat in Missouri, Orvis matched our investment. We made a donation to habitat improvement for grayling on the Big Hole River in Montana, again our contribution was matched by Orvis. We funded the Little Piney insect survey to examine the effects of a gravel mine on Little Piney Creek, the report can view viewed at our Website. We contributed significantly to assist with the purchase of the Bohigian Tract on Mill Creek (now the Bohigian Conservation Area), and contributed labor for stream improvement projects on the Bohigian Conservation Area. We also sponsored Kids Trout Outing at Bethel Park, our objective for the day was to have fun teaching kids to fish.
